Azumah on track for 1Moz resource in Ghana

AZUMAH Resources says its latest assays have confirmed the prospectivity of the Basabli, Kuo and Bepkong targets at the Wa-Lawra gold project in Ghana.

With intersections including 29m at 4.6 grams per tonne gold from 100m at bepkong, 11m at 2.81gpt gold from 69m at Basabli, and 3m at 1.24gpt gold from 31m at Kuo, Azumah said it hoped to be able to define additional resources within the Wa-Lawra project.

The company already has a 516,000oz resource at the Kunché deposit, and expects to announce a maiden resource for the Bepkong deposit – 2km north of Kunché – shortly.

Additionally, other intersections from Bepkong have been re-split and re-sampled, confirming high gold grade assays released previously, the company said.

The junior gold explorer hopes to define 1 million ounces of gold at Wa-Lawra this year.

Shares in Perth-based Azumah were last trading at 14.5c after rising 1c yesterday.
